Mobility Objectives

The mobilities aim to strengthen methodological training, applied research, and academic exchange in **Digital Cultural Heritage**, with a focus on **Archaeology** and **Digital Documentation Methods**.

Key objectives:

- Develop competencies in **digital documentation and analysis** (3D documentation, imaging, digital reconstruction, GIS, spatial analysis)
- Integrate **methodological and theoretical approaches** in archaeology and Digital Cultural Heritage
- Promote **hands-on training, supervised research, and academic exchange**
- Encourage **interdisciplinary dialogue** and maximize academic impact through complementary student perspectives

Duration and Format

- 10 days (short-term mobility)
- Research- and training-oriented mobility for PhD students
- Teaching mobility for staff
- Designed for **focused, high-impact academic exchange**
