Freedom House Romania, with support from the German Marshall Fund's Black Sea Trust for Regional Cooperation, is opening applications for The Black Sea Desk: Writing the Region into Europe, a six-month virtual newsroom for emerging journalists and analysts from Romania, Georgia, and Armenia.

What you'll actually do:

- Join weekly editorial sessions with practitioners covering EU integration, Black Sea geopolitics, and regional security, the kind of access most newsrooms don't give you while still a student;
- Write 4 solo articles and co-author 4 pieces with peers across the three countries, running the full cycle from pitch to published work;
- Publish in English through DW, RFI, and other international outlets, with select pieces translated and republished across Romanian, Georgian, and Armenian media;
- Close out the program in Yerevan, with the rest of your cohort, at an editorial workshop and networking event, plus a €250 completion bonus if you see it through.

We're looking for students of Political Science, International Relations, Journalism, and related fields who already follow this region closely and want to write about it with real editorial backing behind them. Selection is competitive, but for those who put in the work, the program is designed to shape you into a working analyst and writer well before graduation, opening doors into journalism, policy research, think tanks, and international organizations. English proficiency is required, as all work, meetings, and editorial exchanges take place in English.

Timeline: Applications close 20 August. Shortlisted candidates get a short online interview; final decisions land in late August. Program starts early September.
